*"It came even to pass on the third day, that, behold, a man came out of the camp* **To Communicate Forget Not** Imparting Information & Means—It's Biblical James R. Horne, State Overseer

from Saul with his clothes rent, and earth upon his head: and so it was, when he came to David, that he fell to the earth. and did obeisance. And David said unto him. From whence comest thou? And he said unto him, Out of the camp of Israel am I escaped. And David said unto him, How went the matter? I pray thee, tell me. And he answered, That the people are fled from the battle, and many of the people also are fallen and dead; and Saul and Jonathan his son are dead also" (2 Sam. 1:2-4). Here is an illustration of someone communicating important information. "How went the matter?" David asked. The man who came out of the camp of Saul answered with the report. The statistics were conveyed to David, giving him insight of the situation that was on the field. We further read that he was affected by the information shared. In this case, he lamented over the news. In another passage, the Queen of Sheba stated, "It was a true report that I heard in mine own land of thy acts," but the assessment of the report was that it exceeded expectations and that the "half was not told" (1 Kings 10:6, 7).

BTI, Third Term Business, Lesson One, states that communication through "personal reporting is the most common form of reporting in the Bible. From the local church level, to a budding 'general level,' Peter, Barnatiles (Acts 15:7-12). When a decision was reached by the Assembly, there was a reporting of that decision from the general level to the local level in the form of letters (Acts 15:22-23, 30)."

Communicating in certain cases is synonymous with reporting information. Accountability and conveying updates about our work is valuable in that it keeps those over us in the Lord informed of progress, it challenges us to stay active in the work (as mandated by the Assembly), and keeps us in check and connects us as laborers together under God's Government. In some cases, "Local Church reports showing little or no progress," signal that an assessment of the work may be needed. "If evaluations and adjustments are not made, the result will be more of the same, including low morale among the members... or [perhaps reveal the need to address] spiritual problems..." (BTI, 3rd Term Business, p. 9).

The word "communicate" denotes "imparting both information and means," to reveal or convey actions and effort. Another definition represents being "sociable, ready and apt to form and maintain communion and fellowship." We see in our Church history that communication through the reporting system was designated as one of the helps noted in 1 Corinthians 12:28. Moreover, we see this concept in action throughout scripture.

Acts 21:17-19 tell us, "And when we were come to Jerusalem, the brethren received us gladly. And the day following Paul went in with us unto James; and all the elders were present. And when he had saluted them, he declared particularly what things God had wrought among the Gentiles by his ministry." Paul went to communicate something that happened in the ministry, so he reached Jerusalem and was saluted there. The next day he and the brethren went to "Headquarters" unto James (the General Overseer) with the elders present and gave his report by declaring what God had done among the Gentiles.

We see that The Church of God at Philippi communicated with Paul. He said, "Notwithstanding ye have well done, that ye did communicate with my affliction. Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only" (Phil. 4:14, 15). Paul was occupying a position similar to that of a State Overseer, and he commended the Church at Philippi for their faith-

fulness because they communicated with him regarding giving and receiving. In I Timothy 6:18, we further read Paul's appeal, *"That they do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate."* In this context, communicate can mean being "willing to share, inclined to impart, free in giving" (Strong's 2843). We are told in

Hebrews 13:16 and 17, "But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased. Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for that is unprofitable for you."

Our model of reporting is not just some unnecessary function that our forefathers imposed on the Church. It was rather seen as a biblical way of establishing accountability and gleaning information, and it linked our worldwide efforts together as one. Our covenant represents our commitment and shared responsibility with other members of the body, to do things correctly as recommended by the multitude of counselors. Let us note that the Assembly has asked us to report (see Business Guide, pp. 155-157), and we are told that God is "well pleased" when we

do. It further states that a *"good report maketh the bones fat"* (Prov. 15:30). Reporting is also significant for the purpose of record keeping, the importance of which was discussed and established in 1906, at the very first Assembly this side of the Dark Ages. Where would we be without good records of things gone by, whether biblical or historical?

Could it not be further established that reporting and accounting of information was important to the New Testament Church? Did the Church not have a treasurer who handled funds and did it not also have a membership roll of names that was reported? *"Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, Buy those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor"* (John 13:29). *"Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples, and said, (the number of names together were about an hundred and twenty)..."* (Acts 1:15).

If you recollect, communicating can be defined as

"imparting information and means." Our Church Business Guide tells us that funds are sent "with their reports." When we report to State and General Headquarters we are not only obedient and accountable to the government by imparting information regarding that which we have done for God, but we also submit "means or tithes" that are due to the Lord with that information. The Assembly has

designated a financial system through which the whole Church is to operate. Besides free will giving, members pay tithes of their increase into the local church. Ten percent of the member's tithes are sent from the local church to the State/Regional Headquarters. The State then pays ten percent to General Headquarters. The remaining ninety percent of tithes paid into the local church (up to the limit set by the Administrative Committee) is used to give an allotment to the pastor for his support. A minister pays ten percent of his ministerial increase to General Headquarters with his report. All of this is imperative to the operation of our work worldwide. "For brass I will bring gold, and for iron I will bring silver, and for wood brass, and for stones iron: I will also make thy officers peace, and thine exactors righteousness" (Isa. 60:17). God's financial plan of tithing and giving as listed in our Prominent Teaching is well established in scripture: (Gen. 14:18-20; 28:20-22; Mal. 3:10; Matt. 23:23; Luke 1 1:42; I Cor. I 6:2; 2 Cor. 9:6-9; Heb. 7:1-21).

Each of us "count as one" but our efforts, our part of this great work is added to the overall contribution of the whole body (e.g. souls saved, members added, sermons preached, CPMA memberships, subscribed to *The Evening Light*, tithes paid, etc.). Our spiritual labors and faithfulness are further accounted for in heaven (Heb. 6:10). Truly, we lack an accurate representation of our work here on earth when statistics are submitted to Headquarters or are read at the Assembly but are not inclusive of all ministries because some may not have been faithful to communicate the information. The Assembly advises quarterly where possible and it is a wonderful blessing. accuracy and regular reporting to those over us, as well as sending "means" which as designated in the Word belong to and honor God; will bring His blessings upon us, fund the overall effort in this world and give a clearer picture of where we're at in the general labors of the Church in these last days. So to those in ministry, or to whom this applies, consider getting your monthly "communication" ready and mailed by the 5th of each month. To the member, be faithful in tithing and giving at your local church and see what blessings God will pour out on you! To all who are charged with other responsibilities in leadership (at any level) or at whatever interval you are asked to report and to where, these words encourage you by saying, *"to communicate forget not."*

Greetings, my dear brothers and sisters!

At the preparation of

this article for the **Olive Branch**, I am faced with an unexpected trial. I found myself asking God: Why me? Why now? What are you trying to do with me?

Just a few days before I sat down to write this article, I fell as I was going down my basement steps. I was carrying a porch swing pillow which, fortunately, cushioned my fall. However, as I tried to get off the floor, I realized that while all of my limbs seemed to be unscathed and my head had not even hit the floor, my right foot was in excruciating pain and it was clear that this was the part of my body which bore the brunt of my fall. For a moment, I thought how I was blessed to have not received more injuries. So, I struggled to get myself up, hopped up the steps, decided to ice my foot, keep it elevated, and see how I felt the next day.

The next morning, I was still in a great deal of pain but managed to shower and get ready for work. With the intention of eventually going to my job, I decided to first stop at the local Med Express to have my foot checked out. X-rays were taken and it was determined that my fifth metatarsal (the smallest and last bone in my foot) was badly broken. My foot was temporarily casted and I was told to refrain from putting weight on it and to go immediately to an orthopedic specialist for further consultation. At this point, I knew I was facing a serious trial.

I never made it to work that day, in fact, I won't be going to work for at least six weeks. By the time you read this, I will have had surgery to repair the broken bone in my foot. Assuming that all went

well, I will be at home recuperating. I will be navigating with the use of crutches, depending on my husband, daughter, and others to help me get through the day.

I must be brutally honest with you. This injury is most inconvenient! I have

so much going on in the next few weeks—my emotions have ranged from

laughter to tears to anger and frustration. The challenge of using crutches is almost as bad as the injury itself. I was planning to attend BTI... yes, I was! But now this is uncertain. The paid time off I was going to use for my time missed from work may have to be used for my time off due to this injury. Will I still be able to go to BTI?

Why me, Lord? Why Now? Lord, I do not have time for this in my life!

"Stop, Elaine!" our Lord was telling me. "Stop and listen to my Word." These words were brought to my attention and have given me comfort and strength. I am eternally thankful for The Word of God!





Please see the back page for information on the upcoming International Ladies' Retreats and also on the book of poems written by Sister Bishop "Thou shalt not sow thy vineyard with divers seeds: lest the fruit of thy seed which thou hast sown, and the fruit of thy

*vineyard, be defiled*" (Deut. 22:9). This verse contains literal instructions concerning the proper planting of vineyards, but also carries sound spiritual implications. God is a God of separation. This is evidenced from the very beginning of time. When He created light, the Bible records that *"God divided the light from the darkness"* (Gen. 1:4).

It is important that we understand what God desires to join together, and what He desires to separate. Simply put, He desires to join together the things that agree and separate the things that are opposed to one another. Such a simple formula, isn't it? The difficulty arises when we allow divisions to come where He desires unity, and when we try to mingle together things where He requires separation. When God instructs separation it is because His own righteousness demands it, and because He loves us and it is for our own good.

The reason cited for not planting with "divers seeds," meaning "mixed seeds" (two or more kinds of seeds), is that the vineyard would be defiled. This applies to every area of life. Sending mixed messages is always disastrous. In childrearing, a parent may give good, sound instruction and training to the children, but if they witness that same parent compromising biblical standards in any small way, or displaying hypocrisy (failure to personally demonstrate the things taught to the kids), the "mixed seed" will defile and undo all of the good that was intended. A parent may uphold certain Church doctrine and advice while allowing worldliness into their own heart or family in other, seemingly unimportant ways such as questionable music, entertainment, or just about anything, attempting to mix holiness with worldliness, "Having a form of godliness, but denying [contradicting] the power thereof." This is a poison that will destroy all infected with it, thus the straightforward instruction: "from such turn away" (2 Tim. 3:5). Simply an ugly attitude or critical spirit will contaminate the good, godly seeds of love we're trying to plant.

God's instructions in the Old Testament included not mingling among the heathen and especially to not marry outsiders. He clearly sees the dangers that we so frequently fail to recognize: *"For they will turn away thy son from*  *following me*" (Deut. 7:4). Nehemiah recorded the tragic outcome in his day when God's people had intermarried with

others: "And their children spake half in the speech of Ashdod, and could not speak in the Jews' language, but according to the language of each people" (Neh. 13:24). Mixing the standards and lifestyle of God's chosen people with the standards and lifestyle of the worldlings around us will have the same result in our day. Before long, the "language" we speak in the Church of God (a language of love, holiness and purity) will become foreign to us and we'll no longer understand it or be able to speak it, being so influenced by the language of the world around us. We see this in young people who have been raised in the Church, but have been so heavily inundated with the world that they know little about Church history, our forefathers, or even simple Bible doctrine and standards of holiness. How great a loss—with eternal consequences.

The enemy of our souls is constantly trying to weasel his way into The Church of God with philosophies that sound appealing, but are laced with compromise. Anything that compromises God's standards or instructions is "divers" or "mixed" seed and will defile the good seed we're trying so hard to sow in our hearts and those around us. Don't be fooled into thinking little things don't matter. Don't assume they won't affect you or your children. "A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump" (Gal. 5:9). In Deuteronomy, when God was giving instructions on behavior and conduct to His people, He told them why they matter: "Ye are the children of the Lord your God" (14:1), and emphasized, "For thou art an holy people unto the Lord thy God, and the Lord hath chosen thee to be a peculiar people unto himself, above all the nations that are upon the earth" (v. 2). This is later confirmed by the apostle Paul, "What? know ye not that... ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Cor. 6:19, 20). Therefore we're given instructions such as "come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you" (2 Cor. 6:17).

Search your heart and life very carefully. Make sure you are not sowing with mixed seed—compromise of any kind—lest all the good you are working for be "defiled."
